ELSS SUMMARY - ROUND 7

"Mentorship and coaching: sharing best practices and ideas geared towards advancing the lives of marginalized individuals"

Mrs. Lavern Gottshalk (Guest Presenter), Ms. Claudeen Panton and Mr. Howard Mitchell took participants through their paces, November 23, 2017.

The presenters explored, from the perspective of the teacher/facilitator, what it meant to be marginalized. They looked at the challenges marginalized workers faced — a) language barriers, b) cultural differences, c) low motivation, d) difficulties in accessing organizational resources and/or e) identifying, and taking advantage of developmental opportunities. They outlined the coping mechanisms such as building support networks and increasing personal involvement in organizations which welcome individual differences.

They defined 'mentorship' and 'coaching':

- 1. Mentoring (usually long-term) related primarily to the identification and nurturing of potential for the whole person where goals may change but are always set by the learner.
- 2. Coaching, on the other hand, focused on performance improvement (often short-term) in a specific skills area.

The presenters were careful to point out the potential and limitations of either approach.

A very lively panel discussion ensued wrapping up the seminar.

Graduates – Middle Leaders' Training Programme

The Middle Leaders' Training Programme is a tenmodule, 9-months, postgraduate certificate course. Since its inception in 2016, the College has had four cohorts – eight members of the very first cohort graduated in a joint ceremony held February 22, 2018, on the College's Research Day; the College now offers the MLTP at our Brown's Town Campus and, by January 2019, will have two cohorts running concurrently at that location.


